## **Shooters Hill Police Station**



**Benefit:** Warmer and Quieter

**Type:** Change of Use

Shooters Hill, so named because it was allegedly the site for archery practice in the Middle Ages, at 432 feet is one of the highest points in South East London, with panoramic views across to the City and The Thames.

Constructed on the site of an old Gibbet, the former Police Station was built in two stages, spanning the Victorian and Edwardian era and is located at a key point in the Woolwich Common Conservation Area.

Following decommission, the redundant locally Listed buildings and accompanying land were obtained for conversion and development by the LHA-ASRA Group with resulting permission to provide a total of 35 shared ownership homes, 18 of which are one and two-bed apartments sited within the original Police buildings.

The new homes are contemporary in style but great effort was made to ensure they complement the original structures.











The original single glazed windows were retained either through refurbishing or replacing with likefor-like.

Selectaglaze then produced a total of 128 secondary glazed units in a number of styles including sliding and hinged to provide improved thermal insulation and protection against the noise of traffic on this busy road.
